

Regarding estimated budget of AMRUT 2.0 Yojana including delays and the lapses in the implementation of the scheme-laid

SHRI ANURAG SHARMA (JHANSI): The Cabinet has approved the Atal Mission for Rejuvenation and Urban Transformation 2.0 (AMRUT 2.0) up to 2025-26 in October 2021 as a step towards Aatma Nirbhar Bharat. As per the 2011 census, 31% (377 million) of India's population were living in urban areas, and by 2050 more than 50% of India's population is estimated to be urban. Urbanisation is the process of growth of cities (either through a natural increase in population, migration, or physical expansion). This visionary project will be incomplete without mentioning the efforts and good intention of our Hon'ble Prime Minister. Therefore, I urge upon the Government to identify the contributing factors to the issues observed in the estimated budget of AMRUT 2.0 Yojana, including delays and time lapses.
