REVIVAL OF TOURISM SECTOR IN HIMACHAL PRADESH

5. SHRI RAJIV PRATAP RUDY:

Will the Minister of TOURISM be pleased to state:

- (a) whether it is a fact that Himachal Pradesh is one of the most popular tourist destinations in North India;
- (b) whether it is a fact that there has been an increase in frequency of incessant rains and landslides in the State of Himachal Pradesh spelling doom for the travel and tourism sector in the State;
- (c) the quantum of revenue lost due to hotel cancellations and cancellations of tourism packages in the last 5 years;
- (d) whether it is a fact that the heavy rains and landslides are impacting the tourism sector more than the covid-19 lockdown; and
- (e) whether the Government has any long term plan to tackle the issue and keep the tourism sector in Himachal Pradesh beaming and if so, the details thereof?

ANSWER

THE MINISTER OF TOURISM

(SHRI G. KISHAN REDDY)

- (a): The details of Domestic Tourist Visits (DTVs) and Foreign Tourist Visits (FTVs) of the Northern states during 2018-2022 are given in Annexure.
- (c): The Ministry of Tourism does not maintain data on revenue generated/ lost from tourism.
- (b), (d) & (e): As per information received from the National Disaster Management Authority (NDMA):

- i. The State of Himachal Pradesh faced unprecedented rains during July, 2023 which causes floods and landslide across the State. Following these incidents, the State Govt. vide letter dated 25.07.2023. has requested NDMA to provide technical assistance in conducting Post Disaster Needs Assessment (PDNA) in order to prepare long-term Recovery & Reconstruction for the State.
- ii. The NDMA has considered the request and constituted an Expert Group vide order dated 05.08.2023 comprising various stakeholders i.e. Central Government, Institutions and International Organizations to facilitate the PDNA exercise. The exercises were held in two phases i.e. 1st phase (07.08.2023 12.08.2023) and 2nd phase (16.09.23 19.09.2023) to assess damage and loss in 13 identified sectors including Tourism sector.
- iii. As per the recommendation of the XVth Finance Commission for 'Managing seismic and landslide risks in ten hill states' and earmarked allocation of Rs.750 crore.
- iv. Under SDMF, Rs.592.4 Crore has been allocated to HP for Disaster mitigation activities in which central has a share of Rs.533.4 Crore and State has a share of Rs.59 Crore.
- **Currently NDMA** is formulating the Landslide Risk Mitigation v. **Programme** (LRMP) and Earthquake Risk **Mitigation Programme (ERMP). This** program will concentrate on assessing Earthquake and landslide risk, it's vulnerability, implementing monitoring and early warning systems (EWS), stabilizing/ retrofitting and enhancing capacity in this regard. Himachal Pradesh is also included in the proposed programme.
- vi. NDMA has issued two sets of National Disaster Management Guidelines:
 - a. Guidelines on Cultural Heritage Sites and Precincts; and
 - b. Guidelines on Museums.

Both these guidelines are very relevant for the tourism sector in Himachal Pradesh.
