**EMPLOYMENT TO WOMEN**

1786. DR. BACHHAVSOBHA DINESH:

Will the Minister of MICRO, SMALL AND MEDIUM ENTERPRISES be pleased to state:

- (a) the details of the welfare schemes launched by the Government for providing employment to people including women in rural, tribal and backward areas in the country under Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises (MSMEs);
- (b) the total number of small scale industries established in the said areas to provide employment opportunities to women in the country including Maharashtra during the last three years and the current year, State and district-wise;
- (c) the total funds provided to States for providing employment to these women for the said purpose along with the annual target set in this regard during the last five years and the current year;
- (d) whether the Government has taken any other specific steps to provide employment to women through MSMEs in the country including Maharashtra; and
- (e) if so, the details thereof in Maharashtra, district-wise?

**ANSWER**

MINISTER OF STATE FOR MICRO, SMALL AND MEDIUM ENTERPRISES  
(SUSHRI SHOBHA KARANDLAJE)

(a): Government is implementing several schemes/programmes for the benefits of unemployed youths in the country including women in rural, tribal and backward areas which *inter alia* includes:

- i. Prime Minister's Employment Generation Programme (PMEGP):** Ministry of MSME, through Khadi and Village Industries Commission (KVIC), is implementing PMEGP for assisting entrepreneurs across the country in setting up of new units in the non-farm sector. Any individual above 18 years of age is eligible to apply. It aims to provide employment opportunities to traditional artisans/rural and urban unemployed youth at their doorstep. PMEGP being a Central Sector Scheme assists General Category beneficiaries with Margin Money (MM) subsidy of 25% of the project cost in rural areas and 15% in urban areas. For beneficiaries belonging to Special Categories such as Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes, OBCs, Minorities, Women, Ex-servicemen, Differently-abled, Transgenders, beneficiaries belonging to Northeastern Region, Hill and Border areas, and Aspirational Districts, the Margin Money subsidy is 35% in rural areas and 25% in urban areas. Besides, beneficiaries from General Categories contribute 10% of project cost while beneficiaries from Special Categories contribute 5% of project cost. The maximum cost of project is Rs. 50 lakhs in the manufacturing sector and Rs. 20 lakhs in the service sector.

- ii. **Udyam and Udyam Assist Platform (UAP) Portal:** Government had launched “Udyam Registration” for MSMEs, for Ease of Doing Business with effect from 01.07.2020 and Udyam Assist Platform on 11.01.2023 to bring Informal Micro Enterprises under the formal ambit for availing the benefits under Priority Sector Lending.
  - iii. **Credit Guarantee Scheme:** The Ministry of MSME, Government of India is also implementing Credit Guarantee Scheme for Micro and Small Enterprises through Credit Guarantee Fund Trust for Micro and Small Enterprises (CGTMSE), for providing collateral free loan up to a limit of Rs. 500 lakh (with effect from 01.04.2023) to MSEs with a guarantee coverage up to 85% for various categories of loans. Since its inception in 2000, 91.76 lakh guarantees were approved involving an amount Rs. 6.78 lakh crore as on 30.06.2024. For the first time, Rs. 2.00 lakh crore of guarantee coverage crossed in current FY -2023-24.
  - iv. **Khadi and Gramodyog Vikas Yojana (KGVY):** Khadi Vikas Yojana aims to increase productivity and wages of khadi artisans and secure their livelihood. It also assists in improving infrastructure for khadi production and thereby increasing its production and sales. Gramodyog Vikas Yojana aims to revive traditional and inherent skills of rural artisans by imparting advanced skill development training along with distribution of modern toolkits.
  - v. **National Scheduled Caste Scheduled Tribe Hub (NSSH):** A central sector scheme of the Ministry of MSME, Government of India launched in 2016 by the Hon’ble Prime Minister. The scheme aims at capacity enhancement of SC-ST entrepreneurs and promoting "entrepreneurship culture" amongst the SC-ST population. NSSH scheme is empowering SC-ST population to participate in the public procurement process and fulfil the mandated target of 4% procurement from SC-ST enterprises under Public Procurement Policy by the Ministries, Departments and CPSEs.
  - vi. **Coir Vikas Yojana (CVY):** CVY is an umbrella scheme with its six sub-scheme components, formulated with the objective of overall and sustainable development of coir industry in India. The interventions under CVY Scheme envisage a wide range of activities such as Research & Development, skill development of artisans, women empowerment through modernization, upgradation and establishing new units, promoting the domestic as well as export market, providing of trade and industry related functional support services, and welfare of coir workers.
- (b): State-wise and District-wise (Maharashtra) number of units owned by women entrepreneurs under Udyam and PMEGP during the last 3 years and current year are given at **Annexure**.

(c): Under PMEGP, there is no specific target set to provide financial assistance to States for providing employment and entrepreneurship to women. However, State-wise overall Margin Money (MM) subsidy target and achievement under PMEGP scheme during the last 5 years is given below:

# Achievement data till 15<sup>th</sup> July 2024

(d) and (e): Following steps are being taken by the Government all over the country including Maharashtra to include more beneficiaries and creation of employment:

- i. Under PMEGP, Women are classified under Special category wherein the Margin Money (MM) subsidy provided to beneficiaries is 35% of the project cost in rural areas and 25% in urban areas instead of General Category beneficiaries who are provided with Margin Money (MM) subsidy of 25% of the project cost in rural areas and 15% in urban areas. Furthermore, own contribution of beneficiaries under Special Category including women is 05% and 10% for General Category beneficiaries.
  - Maximum project cost admissible has been enhanced from Rs. 25 Lakhs to Rs. 50 Lakhs for Manufacturing sector and from Rs. 10 Lakhs to Rs. 20 Lakhs for Service sector.
  - Applicants from Aspirational districts and Transgenders have been included in Special Category.
  - Industries related to Animal Husbandry like dairy, poultry, aquaculture, insects (bees, sericulture, etc.) have been allowed under the scheme.
  - COVID years i.e., FY2020-21 and FY2021-22 have been exempted while considering profitability of existing PMEGP/ REGP/ MUDRA units applying for 2<sup>nd</sup> Loan under PMEGP.
  - No mandatory EDP for project cost up to Rs. 2 lakh and shorter period of training (up to 5 days) for projects up to Rs. 5 lakh.
  - Awareness camps, workshops and exhibitions at all levels are being organized for creating awareness about the scheme among the prospective entrepreneurs.
  - Publicity of PMEGP scheme through print and electronic media.
  - A two-day free online Entrepreneurship Development Programme (EDP) for prospective entrepreneurs.
  - Webinars are organized on various activities for setting up of micro-enterprises on every Sunday to create awareness among the youth and prospective entrepreneurs.
  - Radio jingles in regional languages have been made to create awareness of the scheme.
- ii. No global tenders for procurement up to Rs. 200 crores.
- iii. Credit Guarantee Scheme for MSEs: Under CGSMSE, through Credit Guarantee Fund Trust for Micro and Small Enterprises (CGTMSE), collateral free loans are provided to MSEs up to a limit of Rs. 500 lakh (since 01.04.2023) with a guarantee coverage up to 85% for various categories of loans.
- iv. Launch of portal, Udyam Assist Platform, for bringing Informal Micro Enterprises in the formal ambit which helped the registered Informal Micro Enterprises to avail the benefits of Priority Sector Lending.
- v. Inclusion of Retail and Wholesale traders as MSMEs with effect from 02.07.2021 for credit purpose.
- vi. Non-tax benefits extended for 3 years in case of an upward change in status of MSMEs.
- vii. Launch of “PM Vishwakarma” Scheme on 17.09.2023 to provide benefits such as credit support, skill training, marketing support, etc. to artisans and crafts people engaged in 18 traditional trades. The Scheme will onboard the beneficiaries on Udyam Assist Platform as “entrepreneurs” in the formal MSME ecosystem.
