- (a) the details of the Ayurswasthya Yojana highlighting its components alongwith notable achievements, since its inception;
- (b) the details of the projects approved and organizations funded under the Ayurswasthya Yojana during the year 2022-23 in the country, State/UT-wise;
- (c) the details of the funds that the Government has earmarked for the Ayurswasthya Yojana for the year 2024-25;
- (d) the details of funds spent on the Ayurswasthya Yojana till December 2023; and
- (e) whether some of the Research Councils under his Ministry are running mobile healthcare programme across the country and if so, the details thereof?

ANSWER

THE MINISTER OF STATE (IC) OF THE MINISTRY OF AYUSH
(SHRI PRATAPRAO JADHAV)

- (a) The Ministry of Ayush is implementing a Central Sector Scheme namely AYURSWASTHYA Yojana, since FY 2021-22. The Scheme has 02 components viz. (i) AYUSH and Public Health (ii) Centre of Excellence (CoE). The detailed guideline of the scheme is available on the Ministry's website (www.ayush.gov.in). The notable achievements under this Yojana since inception is placed at **Annexure I**.

(b) Under the Scheme, the funds are not approved/allocated State/UT-wise. Further, details of the projects approved and organizations funded under the Ayurwashya Yojana during the year 2022-23 are placed at **Annexure II**.

(c) The Government has earmarked fund to the tune of Rs.72.09 Crore for the Ayurwashya Yojana for the year 2024-25.

(d) Under the Ayurwashya Yojana, an amount of Rs.50.99 Crores was released from 2021-22 till December, 2023 to the eligible organizations for implementation of the various projects.

(e) The Research Councils under this Ministry are running mobile health care programme across the country. The details are placed at Annexure **III**.

Details of mobile health care programme being run across the country by Research Councils under this Ministry

Name of Research Council	Details
Central Council for Research in Ayurvedic Sciences	CCRAS is conducting Research Oriented Public Health Care Programme through Outreach activities under TSP Plan (Tribal Health Care Research Programme) in 14 states through 14 CCRAS institutes and under Scheduled Castes Sub Plan (SCSP) in 14 states and 10 states through 15 & 10 institutes in Ayurveda Mobile Health Care Programme (AMHCP-SCSP) & Women and Child Health Care Programme (WCH-SCSP) respectively and extending health care services in remote and urban areas.
Central Council for Research in Unani Medicine	The Council is conducting Mobile Clinical Research Programme with an aim to provide healthcare to the population residing in rural areas and urban slums. A total of 34,129 patients were treated in 475 mobile visits made to these pockets during 2023-24. Similarly, mobile health care program under SCSP/TSP is also being carried out by the 16 Institutes/Units/Centre of the Council. Under this programme, villages predominately having SC/ST population have been selected to create awareness for preventive aspects of different diseases and to provide treatment to the patients through selected centers of the Council. Total number of beneficiaries in SCSP program were 1,41,265 and TSP program were 46,060.
Central Council for Research in Homeopathy	Mobile health care programme under SCSP is being carried out by CCRH. This programme was
