Government of India revises Minimum Support Price (MSP) for every Kharif and Rabi crop based on which procurement of foodgrains is carried out by Government Procuring Agencies. MSP of food grains has increased every year since 2014. The MSP for Wheat, Rice, Coarse grains and Pulses from 2014-15 to 2024-25 is at **Annexure-II**.
