**Will the Minister of RAILWAYS be pleased to state:**

- (a) whether the Government is aware of the difficulties faced by passengers due to 11 pairs of trains not having any stoppage in the Malappuram District on the Shornur Mangalore line;**
- (b) if so, the details thereof;**
- (c) whether the Government is aware of the fact that this situation brings much inconvenience to a large number of train passengers depending upon the stations of the area; and**
- (d) if so, the plan of the Government to address the grievances of the train passengers of the district?**

**(a) to (d) As the Railway network straddles across state/district boundaries, trains are operated and stoppages are provided as per network requirements, across such boundaries. Important stations like Kuttippuram, Tirunnavaya, Tirur, Tanur, Parapanangadi and Vallikunnu Stations located in Malappuram district, are being served by 41 trains, 12 trains, 87 trains, 26 trains, 39 trains and 17 trains respectively. Besides, stoppage of trains is an ongoing process on Indian Railways subject to traffic justification, operational feasibility, etc.**
