- (a) whether the National Institute of Public Financeand Policy (NIPFP) conducts studies on the phase outpattern of Central Sales Tax(CST);
- (b) if so, whether NIPFP has highlighted the dangers in delay of the phase out programme of CST;
- (c) the full details of the dangers highlighted by NIPFP;
- (d) whether the Government have studied these suggestions; and
- (e) if so, the steps proposed in this regard?

Answer

MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF FINANCE (V.DHANANJAYA KUMAR)

- (a),(b) & (c): The Union Government entrusted a study on inter-State sales Taxation in India to NIPF&P. The NIPF&P in its report has highlighted the fact that high rate of CST acts as an obstacle to the formulation of a common market. It has cascading effect, violates inter jurisdictional equity and distorts resource allocation.
- (d) & (e): An Empowered Committee of Finance Ministersof 9 States has been constituted by the Union Government monitor reforms in the Central Sales Tax System. This Committee has asked a Committee of Finance Secretaries of all the States to examine the recommendations made by NIPFPin its report on `Reform of Inter-State sales Taxation in India `and advise the Empowered Committee.
