Will the Minister of URBAN DEVELOPMENT be pleased to state:

- (a) whether there are poor and inadequate sewerage and sanitation facilities in certain States of the country;
- (b) if so, the details thereof, State-wise;
- (c) whether the Government propose to have better planning and to enhance the sewerage and sanitation facilities in the cities during the Ninth Plan period; and
- (d) if so, the steps proposed to be taken in this direction?

Answer

MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF URBAN DEVELOPMENT (SHRI BANDARU DATTATREYA)

(a): Based on the information received from the State PHE Departments and Water Supply & Sewerage Boards, It has been assessed that thout 49% of the urban population in the country have access to sewerage and sanitation facilities as on 31.3.1997. statement showing Statewise coverage of the urban population with these facilities is at Annexure-I.

(b)to(d): Sewerage and sanitation being a State subject, it is primarily the responsibility of the State Governments/urban local bodies to plan, formulate, execute, operate and maintain sewerage and sanitation facilities from the State Plan resources. However, in order to supplement the efforts of the State Government in providing sanitation facilities, a Centrally sponsored Low Cost Sanitation Scheme (LCS) is under implementation by this Ministry. Funds in the form of Government of India subsidy and loan from HUDCO are provided in a synchoronised manner to convert dry latrines into twin pit pour flush toilets and to construct such toilets where non exist. The Working Group on Urban Water Supply and Sanitation Sector for 9th Five Year Plan (1997-2002) constituted by the Planning Commission recommended a target coverage of 75% population with sanitation facilities in urban areas. As against a requirement of Rs.51,284.20 crores for water supply & sanitation sector, the Planning Commission have made a tentative allocation of Rs.18,624 crores for water supply and sanitation, out of which Rs.864 crores are under Central Plan and Rs.17760 crores under State Plan for the 9th Plan Period.
