- (b) The National Highways falling on the alignment of the Golden Quadrilateral connectingthe four metropolitan cities of Delhi, Mumbai, Chennai and Calcutta and North-Southand East-West corridors from Srinagar to Kanyakumari and Silcher to Saurashtra respectively and also the Salem-Cochin section of NH-47 will be upgraded to 4/6 lane facility under the National Highways Development Project (NHDP). The NHDP is estimated to cost Rs. 54,000 crores
- (at current prices) and is targeted to be completed by 2009.
