This Working Group has made a number of recommendations/suggestions including making IT Literacy compulsory for recruitment to Government services and organising of IT Yatras. The Working Group has not made any specific recommendation linking I.T. literacy level to rating in the Confidential Reports as an incentive for promotions. No final decisions have been taken on the various recommendations that the report of the Working Group contains.
