Will the Minister of CHEMICALS AND FERTILIZERS be pleased to state:

- (a) whether it is a fact that Muriate of Potash (MOP) was decontrolled in 1992 and imports decanalised in June, 1993;
- (b) if so, there was no import of MOP since then but private companies are importing it freely;
- (c) If so, whether the farmers are being charged high prices for this product;
- (d) if so, whether Government propose to restrict the private traders from charging high prices of MOP; and
- (e) if so, the steps being taken in this regard?

Answer

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF CHEMICALS & FERTILIZERS (SHRI SATYA BRATA MOOKHERJEE)

(a): Yes, Sir.

(b): Muriate of Potash (MOP) was decontrolled on 25.8.1992 and its imports decanalisedw.e.f 17.6.1993. The imports of MOP and other potassic fertilizers can be made freely on private trade account. There being no commercially exploitable reserves of MOP in the country, the entire requirement is met from imports. Imports of MOP in the country since 1992-93 are given as under:
