- (d) the names of Museum in which these objects are kept and display / accessible to public; and
- (e) if not, the reason therefor?

(a), (b), (c), (d) & (e) A number of archaeological remains from the medieval period have been recovered from the Qutb Archaeological area and have been methodically documented. Of these one is in the National Museum, New Delhi, seven in Archaeological Survey of India's site museum at Purana Qila, New Delhi and the remaining are housed in the Qutb Sub - Circle Office of the Archaeological Survey of India, New Delhi. All these objects are accessible to the public.
