(a), (b), (c) & (d): With a view to introducing greater transparency and openness in the functioning of Government and public bodies, the Government had, in January, 1997, constituted a Working Group on `Right to Information and Promotion ofOpen and Transparent Government` under the Chairmanship of Shri H.D.Shourie.The report of the Group has been processed and a Bill for Freedom of Information has been drafted. The Bill is presently under examination for introduction in Parliament.
