THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE (SHRI A. RAJA)

The Government has taken a number of steps for making Hepatitis C Virus (HCV) screening mandatory in all the blood banks of the country to ensure safe blood transfusion for all including thalassaemic children. Nation wide training for Medical Officers and Laboratory Technicians of Government and Charitable sector blood banks in HCV testing has been completed.Drugs & Cosmetics Rules are being amended to make HCV testing mandatory for blood banks and procurement of HCV Test Kits are underway.
