JRC has interalia directed the Joint Committee of Experts led by Secretary (Water Resources) of both the countries to submit the formulations for the sharing of the water of the six rivers e.g. Manu, Muhuri, Khowai, Gumti, Dharla and Dudhkumar between the two countries for consideration of the JRC at an early date.
