STATEMENT REFERRED IN REPLY TO PARTS (a) TO (e) OF THE LOK SABHA STARRED QUESTION NO. 245 TO ANSWERED ON 14.3.2001

- (a) &(b) The Union Government received two requests from the State Government of Andhra Pradesh in August, 1999 and January, 2000 for reconsidering the issue and for imposing a ban on import of parent level breeding stock.
- (c): No, Sir.
- (d): Does not arise in view of answer to part (c).
- (e): As per the existing import policy, the import of parent level breeding stock of poultry is on the restricted list. The request for imposing a total ban on import of parent level breeding stock was considered and not agreed to as it was felt that such a ban would be contrary to the policy of liberalization in trade to which the Government is committed.
