Will the Minister of FINANCE be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the number of cases of Central Excise and Customs has come down substantially following the liberalization of the import policy by the Government;
- (b) if so, whether the Government are contemplating to reduce the huge establishment expenditure in view of reduced work load;
- (c) if so, the steps being taken by the Government in this direction; and
- (d) if not, the reasons therefor?

(a), (b), (c) and (d): No, Sir.

However, the position reported above notwithstanding, in order to improve efficiency and effectiveness of the administration and reduce expenditure on establishment, a proposal for integrated cadre re-structuring is under consideration for Group `A`,`B`,`C` and `D` cadres in Customs and Central Excise department and the proposalif accepted, may result in reduction of about 5% of total staff strength and recurring saving.
