(c) if so, the details thereof; and

(d) if not, the manner in which affected tobacco growers and labourers are proposed to be compensated and rehabilitated?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE (SHRI A. RAJA)

(a) &(b) A comprehensive legislation which inter-alia includes provisions to ban smoking in public places and advertisement of tobacco products has been introduced in the Rajya Sabha on 7th March, 2001.

The Bill does not have any provisions which directly affect the livelihood of tobacco growers and labourers employed in tobacco industry.
