(a) &(b): Indian Oil Corporation Limited, propose to expand the capacity of Barauni Refinery from 4.2 to 6 Million Metric Tonnes Per Annum at a cost of Rs.1803 crore.

(c) The project is being executed on Lumpsum Turnkey (LSTK) basis. It has been divided in four LSTK contracts out of which 3 have been finalised and the fourth is under finalisation.

(d) The project is scheduled to be mechanically completed by February, 2002.
