(b)to(d) Powers for creation of Group `A`, `B`, `C` & `D` posts, both on the Plan and Non-Plan sides, have been delegated by the Ministry of Home Affairs to the Government of National Capital Territory of Delhi.

(e) Out of 1218 sanctioned posts of medical officers and specialists in Government of National Capital Territory of Delhi included in the Central Health Service, 1067 posts are filled up. Efforts to fill up the remaining posts are underway.
