(a) whether a racket in fake railway tickets has been detected by the Delhi Police ;

(b) if so, the details in this regard ;

(c) the name of places where such rackets have been operating ; and

(d) the steps taken by the Government to curb such activities in the country?

(a)&(b): Yes, Sir. On 7th February, 2000, a team of officials of Jama Masjid Police Station recoverd from `Imran Guest House` located in Jama Masjid area in the National Capital Territory 392 fake Railway tickets alongwith Punching Machine, date stamps and pad, etc. Two persons were arrested and a case FIR No.62/2000 was registered on the same day at Jama Masjid Police Station.

(c): No other instance of this nature come into the notice of Delhi Police during the recent past.

(d): The steps taken by the Government in this regard include, inter-alia, regular checking of agencies/firms dealing in booking of Railway tickets; close watch on the activities of travel agencies/ agents; direction to the ticket checking staff to carefully check the tickets of passengers to detect if fake tickets are being used; regular annoucements at major stations on the public address system advising the passengers not to purchase tickets from unauthorised persons, touts etc.
