Will the Minister of AGRICULTURE be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the Government had launched a Rs.600 crore Cotton Technology Mission last year to promote the cultivation of cotton;
- (b) if so, the details thereof;
- (c) whether the Government have made any review of this programme;
- (d) if so, the outcome thereof;
- (e) the quantum of cotton produced in the country during 1998-99, 1999-2000 and 2000-2001, State-wise;
- (f) the quantum of cotton exported and imported, separately, during the said period, country-wise and the impact of such import on domestic cotton growers; and
- (g) the steps being taken to protect the interest of Indian Cotton growers in this regard?

Answer

MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE (SHRI AJIT SINGH)

(a) to (g): A statement is laid on the Table of the House.

STATEMENT REFFERED TO IN REPLY TO PARTS (a) TO (g) OF LOK SABSITARRED QUESTION NO.46 DUE FOR REPLY ON 30TH AUGUST, 2001.

- (a)&(b): Yes, Sir. The Government of India has launched a Centrally Sponsored Scheme of Technology Mission on Cotton in February, 2000 with a total outlay of Rs. 566.5 crores for increasing production, productivity and quality of cotton. The Technology Mission on Cotton consists of four Mini Missions. The Indian Council of AgriculturalResearch is responsible for implementation of Mini Mission-I covering research aspects and the Department of Agriculture & Cooperation is responsible for the implementation of Mini Mission-II for extension and developmental activities. The Ministry of Textiles is the nodal Ministry for Mini Mission-III for improvement in marketing infrastructure and Mini Mission-IV for the modernization of ginning/pressing factories.
- (c)&(d): Yes, Sir. The Scheme is being reviewed regularly by the EmpoweredCommittee under the chairmanship of Cabinet Secretary to the Government of India as well as by the Standing Committees constituted for each Mini Mission under the chairmanship of the concerned Secretary to the Government of India. Apart from these Committees, the Agriculture Commissioner to the Government of India who is also the Mission Director, has been regularly monitoring the implementation of the Mission. Based upon these reviews, necessary modifications, in operational guidelines are being carried out in order to improve this Scheme.
- (e): Data on the state-wise cotton production during 1998-99 and 1999 2000 is enclosed (Annexure-I). The data for the year 2000-01 has not yet been finalised.
- (f): The statement regarding import and export of cotton during 1998-99, 1999-2000 and 2000-01 from important countries is enclosed (Annexure-II & III respectively). In so far as the impact of import of cotton on cotton growers is concerned, so far there seems to have been no adverse impact as the cotton prices remained higher than the Minimum Support Price.
- (g) To safeguard the interests of the cotton growers, besides the implementation of the Technology Mission on Cotton, the Government also announces Minimum Support Pricefor cotton each year and guarantees its procurement, if the price falls below the Minimum Support Price, through the Cotton Corporation of India in all States except Maharashtra In Maharashtra, the State Government itself procures cotton under its Cotton Monopoly Procurement Scheme.
