- (b) if so, the details thereof; and
- (c) if not, the reasons therefor?

Answer

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HOME AFFAIRS (I.D. SWAMI)

(a)&(b): No, Sir.

(c): Most of the demands for creation of new States aim at reducing disparities in development, insulation against exploitation and neglect, and protection of local culture and identity. Creation of large numbers of small States will be inadvisable on administrative, financial as well as security considerations. The Government of India has generally followed the approach that regional disparities in economic development is a matter to be tackled through the mechanism of planning and creation of institutions like Development Boards and Autonomous Councils.
