(a), (b) & (c) A White Paper brought out by the Confederation of Indian Industry (CII) on Biotechnology on the fast track: Realizing Regulatory Reformdoes not suggest the setting up of a National Biotechnology Commission. The White Paper however, has recommended that a Single Window application processing cell headed by a competent officer with full time responsibility be set up. Setting up a dedicated web site, end-product characterization, some changes in the existing proforma and expeditious clearance of the proposals are some of the other recommendations. The White Paper is presently under discussion for further consideration by the government.
