LIFTING OF WATER FROM NAGARJUNSAGAR RESERVIOR

Will the Minister of WATER RESOURCES be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the Government have received any proposal from the Andhra Pradesh Government to lift 16.5 TMC of water from the foreshore of Nagarjunsagar Reservior on the Inter-state Krishna River which requires clearance from Central WaterCommission for World Bank Funding;
- (b) if so, whether the project has been cleared by Central Water Commission; and
- (c) if not, the reasons therefor and the time by which it is likely to be cleared?

Answer

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF WATER RESOURCES (SMT. BIJOYA CHAKRAVARTY)

(a) to (c) The Government of Andhra Pradesh during April, 1998 had sent a project report to the Central Water Commission (CWC) which envisaged to draw 16.5 TMC of water from Nagarjunsagar reservoir on Krishna river. As it involved consumptive use of 3.30 TMC, the StateGovernment was requested to furnish details for meeting this requirement from Nagarjunsagar project. The State Government in their reply during August 2001 has proposed to meet the requirement of 3.30 TMC of water out of the savings from evaporation losses for the Srisailam reservoir. The Integrated Working Tables of Srisailam, Nagarjunsagar Project and Prakasham Barrage received during October 2001 in CWC are under appraisal from inter-State aspects. As such, the project as of now, has not got the approval of the Central Water Commission.
