MEGA POWER PROJECTS ON IMPORTED COAL

Will the Minister of POWER be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the Government propose to set up mega power projects in the country based on imported coal;
- (b) if so, the details thereof;
- (c) whether the Government have decided to consider central organisation to co-ordinate with private power projects and State Electricity Boards for proper distribution of power generated in the power sector; and
- (d) if so, the details thereof?

Answer

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF POWER

(SHRIMATI JAYAWANTI MEHTA)

identified as mega power projects to be developed under the revised mega power projects policy announced in November, 1998, are envisaged to use imported coal.

- (b): The details are as follows:-
- S1. Name of the Fuel State Capacity No. Project $\mbox{\sc MW}$
- 1. Cuddalore TPP Blend of Imported Tamil Nadu 1000
 - & Indigenous Coal
- 2. Krishnapatnam TPP Blend of Imported Andhra Pradesh 1500
 - & Indigenous Coal
- 3. Pipavav TPP Imported Coal/LNG Gujarat 2000

The actual Fuel in respect of the Pipavav TPP will depend upon the offers submitted by the preferred bidder.

(c) & (d): A Power Trading Corporation (PTC) has been incorporated on 16th April, 1999 as a public limited company under the Companies Act, 1956. The PTC would purchase power fromthe identified mega power projects in the private sector and sell it to the concerned State ElectricityBoards (SEBs)/Utilities.Security to the PTC would be provided by means of aLetter of Credit and recourse to the State's share of Central Plan Allocations and other devolutions. In case found feasible, PTC can also supply power directly to a 'cluster' like licensees and industrial establishments. The Power Trading Corporation has been set up to facilitate distribution of power from identified mega projects as well as other large inter-State projects by mitigating the risk involved in dealing with several financially weak SEBs. PTC is, at present, structuring the Pipavav mega project (2000 MW) in Gujarat and Hirma mega project (6x660 MW) in Orissa.
