- (a): Yes, Sir.
- (b): According to an informal estimate about 1000 Indian IT engineers are currently employed in Indian and Japanese companies as well as multinational software companies in Japan.
- (c): The DOEACC(Department of Electronics Accreditation of Computer Courses) Society, an autonomous body of Ministry of Information Technology engaged in promotion of Information Technology education and training in the non-formal sector and CAIT (Central Academy for Information Technology), Japan Information Processing Development Corporation (JIPDEC)µnder the Ministry of International Trade and Industry (MITI), Japan had signed an MOU formutual recognition of DOEACC `Alevel course with CAIT`s Fundamental Information Technology and Engineers Examination (FE-SS).In addition, Government of Japanhas decided to issue multiple entry visas, valid for three years, for short-term business stays, allowing & period of stay of 90 days for business people of Indian nationality in IT related enterprises that are located in India and promote exchange between IT specialists from Japan & India.
