THEFT OF VEHICLES

**Will the Minister of HOME AFFAIRS be pleased to state:**

- (a) the number of cases of theft of vehicles registered in Delhi during the last six months, till date, district-wise;
- (b) the number of vehicles recovered during the said period;
- (c) the reasons for high non-recovery cases;
- (d) whether Delhi Police has introduced short message service to check theft of vehicles in Delhi;
- (e) whether the Government are contemplating to introduce the said service in other parts of the country too;
- (f) if so, the time by which it is likely to be introduced; and
- (g) if not, the reasons therefor?

**Answer**

(a) & (b): The number of cases of stolen vehicles registered in Delhi, district-wise, during the period from 1st October, 2001 to 31st March, 2002 and the number of vehicles recovered is given as under:-

(c): The Main reasons because of which Delhi Police find it difficult to recover a larger number of stolen vehicles are absence of hinterland in Delhi; a large number of exit points which enables the car thieves to quickly move out of territorial limits of Delhi; and re-registration of stolen vehicles out side Delhi.

(d): The S.M. Service launched by Delhi Police mainly facilitates the members of public to find out the current status of their stolen vehicles.

(e) to (g): As `police` and law and order are State subjects, it is essentially for the State Governments concerned to take appropriate decision in the matter.
