- (a) the details of bullet proof jackets purchased for Para-Military Forces and BSF Jawans during the last 3 years and the cost thereof;
- (b) whether the Bullet proof jackets purchased for Para-Military forces and BSF Jawans fighting the low intensity conflict in J&K have been found to be sub-standard;
- (c) if so, the facts and details thereof;
- (d) whether the preliminary testing of the quality of the jackets were conducted;
- (e) if so, the details thereof; and
- (f) the steps taken by the Government to bring transparancy in the purchase of such items?

Answer

(a): In the past 3 years, 1200 nos. of Bullet Proof Jackets had been purchased by Central Para Military Forces including BSF as per details given below:-

- (b): No, Sir.
- (c): Does not arise.
- (d)&(e): Test evaluation of the samples is done by actual firing as per laid down specifications, by the designated inspecting authority. Only offers of the firms whose samples successfully withstand the test and are declared to be acceptable by the testing authority are considered for further processing and placement of orders.
- (f): Procurement is ensured through open tender procedures in two bid system. Price bids of only the technically qualified tenderers are opened in the presence of firms's representatives. The samples are also evaluated in presence of the representative of the firms.
