(a)to(e) Recently, certain inclusions/amendments in the Central list of Other Backward Classeshave been brought out vide Gazette of India Notifications No. 241 dated 27.10.1999 and No. 270 dated 6.12.1999. The National Commission for Backward Classes has been set up as per provisions under the NCBC Act., 1993,. The Commission examines the requests for inclusion of anyclass of citizens as backward class in the Central List of OBC and hears complaints of over-inclusion or under-inclusion of any backward class in the list and tenders such advice based on criteria covering social, educational and economic aspects of backwardness to Central Government as it deems appropriate. As per section 9 (2) of the NCBC Act, the advice of the Commission is ordinarily binding the Central Government.

(f & g) The National Commission for Backward Classes has considered the proposal to include Khandayats of Orissa in Central List of OBCs and has recommended rejection of the request for its inclusion.
