AIIMS, New Delhi has a First Generation Robotic Technology facility at the Cardio-Thoracic Centre which is functional IIMS also has a proposal to establish the Second Generation Robotic Technology facility at its Cardio-Thoracic Centre. It is still at conceptual stage and would need assessment by the various Technical Committees and also requisite approvals before it can be taken up for implementation.

The robot assisted surgery in the field of medicine is a new development. It is very cost intensive and even in most developed countries, the technology is used in only special and emergent circumstances. It is expensive and a large percentage of the country's population may not be able to afford it.
