- (a) the number of men, women and children detected with HIV positive or full flown AIDS during each of the last three years; Statewise/Union Territory-wise;
- (b) whether AIDS victims have increased in India;
- (c) if so, the reasons of the increase in incidence of HIV/AIDS; and
- (d) the corrective steps taken to meet the growing challenge of this source?

(a): The State-wise/Union Territory-wise estimated number of HIV infected persons as on mid 1998 is annexed. The reported number of full blown AIDS cases during the last three years as follows:

- (b) Yes, Sir.
- (c) The main reasons for the increase in incidence of HIV/AIDS are :-
- Poverty and lack of education leading to low awareness level.
- Large scale migration of population to different parts of the country.
- No vaccine or cure for elimination of the virus from the body of infected persons.
- (d) Govt. of India has launched comprehensive National AIDS Control programme in all states and UTs including the following keys:-
- ðReducing the spread of HIV in groups at high risk by identification of target populations and providing peer counseling, condom promotion, treatment of sexually transmitted infections etc.
- ðPreventive intervention for the general population by Information, Education and Communication (IEC) and awareness campaign, provision of voluntary testing and counseling, safe blood transfusion services and prevention of occupation exposure.
