Tea

Government/ Tea Board are taking various steps to develop tea industry in various areas including Southern States. The measures supporting include extension of tea area, replanting of old and uneconomical section, improvement of quality through replacement of old and worn out tea machinery in tea factories, creation of irrigation facilities, extending advisory services to small growers, research & development support, organizing training programmes on modern aspects of tea growing for small tea growers etc.

Coffee

Government/Coffee Board has undertaken various developmental measures to promote and assist the coffee industry under its plan schemes. An exclusive small sector development scheme has been implemented in the three coffee growing states viz. Karnataka, Kerala and Tamil Nadu which envisage financial assistance for water augmentation activities and establishment of infrastructure at farm level for upgrading the quality of coffee produced.

So far as Spices and Tobacco industry are concerned, information is being collected and will be laid on the Table of the House.
