- (a) whether any orientation programme for medical officers working in primary health centers has been launched by the Government;
- (b) if so, the details thereof;
- (c) the outcome of the programme during each of the last three years in each State;
- (d) whether the Union Government have decided to start super speciality services at the primary health centers in the country to reduce the burden on referral hospitals;
- (e) if so, whether all the PHCs are likely to be upgraded in the country for the purpose;
- (f) if so, the total expenditure likely to be met on this expansion; and
- (g) the funds allocated to each State for PHCs during the last three years, State-wise?

Answer

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE (SHRI A. RAJA)

- (a) & (b) Yes, Sir. The following training programmes for medical officers have been launched by Government:
- (i) Integrated Skill Development Training for Medical Officers (Primary Health Centres)
- (ii) Specialized skill Training Programme for Medical Officers in:
- ð Medical Termination of Pregnancy
- ð Minilap
- ð No Scalpel Vasectomy
- (c) Details are given at Annexure-I.
- (d) A Primary Health Centre provides health care, reproductive and child health care and family welfare services. It is staffed by one Medical Officer, who is not a specialist. For the provisioning of super-specialist services, teams of specifically trained super-specialists, high-tech equipments and appropriate infrastructural facilities are required. As such PHCs are not considered suitable for the provisioning of super specialist services.
- (e) No, Sir.
- (f) Does not arise.
- (g) The expenditure in Primary Health Centres is met from State Sector Budgets and funds for Basic Minimum Services Programme. A statement of allocation under Health/BMS during last three years is at Annexure-II.
