- (e) whether the Government propose to expand the NHAI; and
- (f) if so, the details thereof and the steps proposed for making the NHAI more responsive and efficient?

- (a) & (b) A representation was received from an individual for separating construction and finance from the functions of present organization of NHAI. No other details were furnished. The Government did not find the suggestion feasible.
- (c) & (d) No action has been taken by the Government.
- (e) There is no such proposal at present.
- (f) Does not arise. Based on our experience so far, the NHAI Act, 1988, provides adequately for the Authority to be an efficient and responsive organization.
