ASSESSMENT TO NTPC ON DURGAPUR AND BOKARO STEEL PLANTS

Will the Minister of POWER be pleased to state:

- (a) whether National Thermal Power Corporation has completed the assessment on the various aspects of the captive power plant of Raurkela Steel Plant;
- (b) if so, the details therefore;
- (c) whether similar assessment has also been made by NTPC on Durgapur and Bokaro Steel Plant;
- (d) if so, the details thereof along with the performance of these captive power plants;
- (e) whether there is any proposal for the expansion of these plants;
- (f) if so, the details thereof; and
- (g) if not, the reasons therefor?

Answer

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF POWER (SHRIMATI JAYAWANTI MEHTA)

- (a) & (b): Yes, Sir. The Captive Power Plant-II (CPP-II) of Rourkela (2x60 MW) \$20 MW was assessed by National Thermal Power Corporation (NTPC). Thereafter a joint venture company of NTPC and Steel Authority of India Limited (SAIL) has been formed with the name `NTPC SAIL Power Company Pvt. Ltd in March 2001 to take over, operate and maintain the power plant.
- (c) & (d): Assessment was also done in case of Durgapur CPP-II.lt has been taken over and is being operated and maintained by NTPC SAIL Power Company Pvt. Ltd.

For the Captive Power Plants of Bokaro Steel Plant it has been decided by SAIL and Damodar Valley Corporation (DVC) to form a Joint Venture Company to take over, operate and maintain the power plant.

(e) to (g): There is no proposal for expansion of these plants.
