- (d) if so, the reaction of the Government thereto?

- (c) & (d) UN Security Council Resolution 1172 has been rejected by India as prescriptive and sovereignty violative. India's views on that resolution have been conveyed to our interlocutors. India's bilateral dialogue with key interlocutors is based on the premise that India is a state possessing nuclear weapons and will maintain a minimum credible nuclear deterrent in accordance with its own assessment of its national security requirements.
