- (c) the funds allocated therefor during the Ninth Five Year Plan;
- (d) the funds utilized by these coal companies during the said plan period; and
- (e) the amount spent on the welfare of the workers of coal mines during the said period?

(a) to (e): A statement is laid on the Table of the House.

- (a) & (b): A revival package for Singareni Collieries CompanyLimited (SCCL) is under implementationand the revival of Eastern Coalfields Limited (ECL), Bharat Coking Coal Limited (BCCL) and Central Coalfields Limited (CCL) is being considered.
- (c) & (d): For Voluntary Retirement Scheme (VRS) in ECL, BCCL and CCL Rs. 701.32 crore were spent during the Ninth Five Year Plan period form the funds provided by the Government of India. Rs. 335.01 crore were given to SCCL as part of the revival package under implementation during the Ninth Five Year Plan period by way of equity and loan by the Government of India.
- (e): The amounts spent on the welfare of the workers of the coal mines during the Ninth Plan period by the CIL and its subsidiaries and the Singareni Collieries Company Limited (SCCL) were Rs. 6388.75 crore and Rs. 1120.28 crore respectively.
