## Will the Minister of COMMUNICATIONS AND INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY be pleased to state:

- (a) the criteria being followed for releasing the commemorative postage stamps in honour of distinguished Indian personalities;
- (b) the details of the proposals pending/under consideration for release of commemorative postage stamps;
- (c) the time by which decision is likely to be taken thereon;
- (d) whether the Government have released commemorative postage stamps in the memory of any industrialist/sports person in the past; and
- (e) if so, the details thereof?

## **Answer**

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF COMMUNICATIONS AND INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY (DR. S PASWAN)

- (a) Proposals for commemorative postage stamps, including those on distinguished Indian personalities, are examined in the light of specific guidelines for the purpose. These guidelines, inter-alia, stipulate that personalities on whom commemorative stamps may be issued should be of national or international importance and the occasion to be commemorated, should be of birth centenary or to mark the 10th/ 25th/ 50th/ 100th death anniversary. Not more than one stamp is generally issued on the same personality and the guidelines also stipulate that stamps may not be issued in honour of individuals whose main achievements are confined to the field of religion. Further, the guidelines require that no stamp on living personality be issued, and normally, out of the total commemorative stamps issued in a year, stamps on personalities are not to exceed 25%.
- (b) The list is enclosed at Annex-I.
- (c) Proposals received for issue of special/commemorative stamps are examined by the Philatelic Advisory Committee(PAC) on the basis of guidelines on the subject to ensure philatelic value of stamps. Final decision regarding the proposals will have to await the views of the Committee.
- (d) Yes, Sir.
