UNSTARRED QUESTION NO:1307 ANSWERED ON:26.11.2002 RESERVE AND EXPLORATION OF MINERALS BY GSI AND NMDC ANANTA NAYAK

Will the Minister of COAL AND MINES be pleased to state:

- (a) the details of the survey undertaken by the Geological Survey of India (GSI) and National MineraDevelopment Corporation (NMDC) in Orissa and other states during the last three years and the current year;
- (b) the reserve of various minerals in those States according to the last survey, State-wise; and
- (c) the steps taken for the proper exploitation of these minerals?

Answer

THE MINISTER OF COAL AND MINES (SUSHREE UMA BHARTI)

(a): During the last three years Geological Survey of India (GSI) has carried out surveys for Noble Metals, Base Metals, Coal, Iron-ore Manganese, Chromite & Diamonds in the state of Orissa. During the field season 2002-03, surveys will be continued by GSI. National Mineral Development Corporation (NMDC) has not undertaken any surveys in Orissa during this period. However, it has carried out exploration for Diamond in the state of Andhra Pradesh and Iron-Ore in the state of Chattisgarh.

Mineral surveys conducted by GSI in different states of the country during the last three years are as follows:

- (b) As a result of surveys carried out by GSI and other agencies in the country, the state-wise reserves of major ores/minerals in the country is given in Anneuxre I.
- (c): The National Mineral Policy, 1993 and its subsequent amendments by the Government are aimed at speedy and systematic exploitation of the mineral resources by the state. Any Indian National or a Company as defined in sub-section (1) of Section 3 of the Companies Act, 1956 is free to exploit the mineral reserves after getting mining lease in accordance with the provisions of the Mines and Minerals (Development & Regulation) Act, 1957 and Rules framed thereafter. However, the exploitation of the minerals depends on their economic viability.
