## Will the Minister of WATER RESOURCES be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the Union Government propose to spend Rs. 1,200 crorein Karnataka on the Grameena Jalasamvardhane Scheme launched by the Prime Minister on Independence Day;
- (b) if so, the total amount earmarked for South Zone;
- (c) whether some schemes were discussed during the meeting of the All India Irrigation Ministers in the recent past;
- (d) if so, whether the Government of Karnataka has urged the Union Government for financial assistance for irrigation projects under Accelerated Benefit Programme; and
- (e) if so, the schemes that are being financed by the Union Government in this regard?

## **Answer**

## THE MINISTER OF WATER RESOURCES (SHRI ARJUN CHARAN SETHI)

- (a) & (b) The Prime Minister in his address to the Nation on Independence Day 2002 has stated that a scheme viz. "Pradhan Mantri Grammen Jal Samvardhan Yojna" would be unveiled shortly. The scheme is under formulation and details are being worked out.
- (c) In the last meeting of the Irrigation/Water Resources Ministers of all States and Union Territories held on 24th September, 2001, the draft National Water Policy was discussed and finalised.
- (d) & (e) Government of India is providing financial assistance to Government of Karnataka under Accelerated Irrigation Benefits Programme for the schemes, namely Upper Krishna Stage-I; Upper Krishna Stage-II; Malprabha; Ghatprabha; Gandorinala, Hirehalla; Karanja and Maskinala. Accordingly, Central Loan Assistance (CLA) amounting to Rs. 185 crore has been released to the Government of Karnataka so far during the year 2002-2003.
