Will the Minister of PLANNING be pleased to state:

(a) whether an internal assessment by the Planning commission has revealed that GDP growth projection for the current fiscal may have to be lowered to 5.5 per cent from 6.5 per cent earlier on account of the drought situation prevailing in some parts of the country;

(b) whether the Government's attention has been drawn towards news item `UNProjects lower Economic Growth for India` published in `The Hindu` onOctober 10, 2002 wherein it has been stated that due to present famine like situation and tension at the border in India, the pace of economic growth during the year 2002 would be slow;

(c) if so, the facts of the matter reported therein;

(d) the reaction of the Government thereto;

(e) to what extent the drought this year has affected the GDP growth; and

(f) what are the steps being considered by the Government in this regard?
