The Canadian International Development Agency (CIDAassisted India-Canada Collaborative HIV/AIDSProject in Karnataka and Rajasthan started in 2001 and Central funds were released to implementing agencies in the financial year 2001-2002. However, in the absence of statements of expenditure, no reimbursement has so far been claimed from the funding agency.

(f) These projects are implemented through Government of India budgetary resources and later on after receipt of Statements of Expenditure from the Implementing Agencies viz. State AIDS Control Societies, reimbursement is sought from the funding agencies.
