- (e) whether the Government propose to scrap the scheme; and
- (f) if not, the steps taken by the Union government to make Swajaldhara scheme more effective?

(a) to (f) Swajaldhara is a demand driven, community led participatory mode of rural water supply scheme as per the reform initiative of the Government of India. The programme is proposed to be launched on 25.12.2002 for implementation across the country based on proposals received from villages, Gram Panchayats and Blocks etcthrough the State Government. No scheme under Swajaldhara has so far been sanctioned by the Government.
