- (c) whether the main cause of migration is hunger and poverty;
- (d) whether the central schemes meant for rural development such a food for work and other rojgar schemes have not been properly implemented in the State;
- (e) if so, the reasons therefor; and
- (f) the persons responsible for the same with the action taken by the Government in this regard?

(b)&(c) The Sampoorna Grameen Rozgar Yojana (SGRY) and the Special Component ofhe SGRY are in operation in all the districts of Orissa to provide additional wage employment as well as food security and also to prevent migration of the rural poor. The State Government of Orissa has reported that migration is not due to hunger or lack offood security. However, some people continue to migrate to the neighboring urban areas and States for relatively better remuneration and opportunities of employment.
