(a) Yes, Sir.

(b)&(c) : The total no. of sanctioned on-going projects is as under:

New Lines 81 Gauge Conversion 71 Doubling 85 Railway Electrification 23 Metropolitan Transport Projects 18

In view of the very large number of projects and the limited availability of funds, it is not possible to lay a firm time schedule for completion of these projects.

(d): In order to ensure early completion of projects, Railways are making constant efforts to augment the resource base by increasing the internal generation of revenue; arranging financial participation by Private Parties and the State Governments in the execution of Railway projects; obtain additional Budgetary Support, etc.

To ensure judicious allocation of resources, these projects have been prioritised on the basis of their physical progress, operational importance, national and strategic significance and social desirability.
