# Will the Minister of STEEL be pleased to state:

- (a) Whether the DOPT has introduced 'Post Based Roster' in place of 'Vacancy Based Rostersfor implementing reserving system with effect from July 2, 1997;
- (b) if so, reasons therefor,
- (c) whether while introducing 'Post Based Rosters' in place of 'Vacancy Based Rosters' theprocess of identifying excesses/shortages, if any, in Class I, II, III and IV category of services under the Ministry of Steel and Mining and all the Autonomous/Statutory Organisations, attached/Sub-ordinate offices and Public Sector Undertakings was undertaken as prescribed under para (5) of the DOPT O.M. No. 36012/2/96-Estt. (Res) dated July 2, 1997; and
- (d) if so, the details of excesses/shortages found in all the above category of services as on July 2, 1997?

## **Answer**

#### MINISTER OF STATE FOR STEEL (SHRI DILIP RAY)

- (a) & (b): Yes, Sir. The earlier Vacancy Based Rosters were replaced by the Post BasedRosters with effect from 2.7.1997 by the Department of Personnel & Training, Government ofIndia vide their O.M. No. 36012/2/96-Estt. (Res.) dated 2nd July, 1997 to implement the Supreme Court Judgement in the case of R.K. Sabharwal Vs. State of Punjab read with the Judgement in the case of J.C. Mallik Vs. Union of India.
- (c) & (d): Ministry of Steel has only one attached office viz. Development Commissioner forIron & Steel (DCI&S) at Calcutta with 4 Regional Offices. There is no Statutory or autonomous organisation under the Ministry of Steel. Post Based Rosters were introduced in the Ministry of Steel as well as the Office of DCI&S and excess/shortages were identified in Class I, II, Idand IV Category of services. The details are as given below:
