- (a) At present 1856 telephone exchanges are working in Rajasthan out of which 80 telephone exchanges are working in Jodhpur district. The district-wise details are given in Annexure.
- (b) Yes Sir.
- (c) It is proposed to set up 100 telephone exchanges during 2000-2001 and 100 more in 2001-2002.
- (d) Demand for Grants for the year 2000-2001 in respect of Department of Telecom Serviceshas not been approved by the Parliament yet. The allocation of funds State-wise will be done only after the approval of Demand for Grants of the DoTS by the Parliament.
