- (b) if so, whether any comprehensive action plan besides constituting a National Commission on Population has been worked out to achieve the target of zero growth;
- (c) if so, the details thereof; and
- (d) the time by which the zero growth target is likely to be achieved thereunder?

- (a) No, Sir. According to latest estimates (1998) by the United Nations, India's population is expected to cross China's population by the year 2045.
- (b),(c)&(d) The long term objective of the National Population Policy 2000 is to achieve a stable population by 2045, at a level consistent with the requirements of sustainable economic growth, social developments and environmental protection. In order to achieve that, a comprehensive action plan covering unmet needs for family planning services, convergence of service delivery at village level, contraceptive technology etc. has been drawn.
