(a) the number of applicants who were issued passports during the last three years from Bareilly, Moradabad and other districts under the jurisdiction of the Passport Office, Bareilly is as follows:

- (b) At present, opening of a Passport Office at Moradabad is not being considered.
- (c) Does not arise.
- (d) Average number of applications received per annum during the last three years from Moradabad was 4356. The opening of a new passport office is governed by certain criteria such as the location of existing offices, volume of applications from a particular region and the recommendations of the Standing Committee of Parliament of External Affairs thatthere should be at least 50,000 applications per annum from an area for a new passport office to be opened. In view of this, opening a passport office at Moradabad is not being considered.
